CONSTITUTION OF THE UNIVERSITY OF QUEENSLAND BUSHWALKING CLUB.

Name

The name of the Club shall be the University of Queensland Bushwalking Club.

Objects

To encourage walking for recreation and to provide regular meetings for those interested in bushwalking and allied outdoor activities.

To provide facilities, as required, for outings and to encourage individually planned trips.

To support and promote preservation and conservation activities.

To collect and collate information of interest to the club.

Membership

Membership shall be open to students, staff and graduates of the University of Queensland, to graduates of Universities recognised by the University of Queensland, and to previous members of the club.

Any person who, in the opinion of the committee, violates the general code of hiking and camping conduct shall be rejected or ejected, on a motion moved at a General Meeting of the Club of which the person shall be given a previous hearing.

Members whose subscriptions are in arrears for a period of three calendar months after the first general meeting of the year shall be deprived of membership.

Admission

Persons desiring admission shall apply formally to the Secretary.

Guests

A member may not bring more than two guests nor may a guest attend more than two trips, in any one year, without the permission of the committee. Guests shall pay a guest fee of 2/- per trip.

Committee

The committee shall consist of President, Secretary, Treasurer, Librarian, Outings Officer and Equipment Officer.

The committee shall have power to co-opt.

Elections

Elections shall be held at the A.G.M. early in third term, and shall be adequately advertised for at least a fortnight previously.

Members shall also be elected as vacancies occur.

Nominations, signed by two people and the nominee, shall be in the hands of the Secretary before the meeting.

Subscription

Annual subscription shall be 5s.Od.

Mechings

Modings shall be held at frequent intervals.

Special meetings may be called by a petition of ten members.

Quora

Three shall be a quorum for a Committee meeting and fifteen for a General Meeting.

Alteration of Constitution

The Constitution may be altered at any General Meeting by a two-thirds majority of those present at such a meeting, provided notice of the amendment is adequately advertised for one week previously.
