CIRCULAR.

From now on, trips will be assigned a grading, either easy, normal, hard or impossible. This is for the benefit of members who have not been in the area before, and wish to know what to expect, barring external conditions such as the weather being fine, or the leader not turning up.

- Easy: any person could go on it, with speeds restricted e.g. Cordeaux to Castle.
- Normal: midway between easy and hard. No previous experience would be needed, e.g. last two days of the Lizard Lookout-Panorama Pt. trip.
- Hard: Speed, length of day, and type of country not restricted. Previous experience would be needed.

A basecamp at Numinbah Valley combined with a thruwalk from the basecamp, up Hobwee to Coomera Crevice, Binna-Burra, Egg Rock and Turtle Rock. It should be a normal walk.

Australia Day Trip..... 25th January, 1960.

Combined basecamp and thruwalk. The basecamp will be at the Albert-Moran junction. Within easy reach will be Castle Craig, Black Canyon, Lost World, Moran's Falls, Mt. Widgee. The thruwalk will start from the Bee Villa (near Bernard O'Reilly's), up Christmas Creek to Pt. Lookout, up Throakban, Widgee, to Lost World, Albert-Moran junction. Classification of the thruwalk will be hard, but well worth it, besides getting away from Brisbane's heat.
