EASTER TRIP. (29th March-2nd April)ALBERT RIVER.

BASE CAMP.... from which many interesting sections of Lamington National Park can be visited. e.g. Lost World, Black canyon, Red Rock Cutting, Thunder Falls, Lightning Falls, Moran Falls, Mt. Widgee, Buchanan's Ford etc.

THROUGH WALK. ...which will come from Border loop on the Interstate Railway Line to Running Ck. Falls. From here it may break up into two parties, one going direct via Buchanans Fort to Albert River in two days and the other veering off to Pt. Lookout and the old Stinson Crash and then to Albert River by any of a number of routes taking 3 to 3½ days.
