RULES.

1. Camp sites must be left tidy. It is the responsibility of each person to dispose of at least his own rubbish. Tins should be burned, bashed and buried; food and paper should be burned, and fires should be put out and covered with earth.
2. People must inform, and obtain permission from the trip leader before breaking away from the party.
3. No alcoholic liquor is allowed on trips.
4. No fraternizing will be tolerated on trips.
5. When within a National Park the regulations must be observed. These include the complete protection of all plant and animal life. No souvenirs to be taken home.

ETIQUETTE etc.

1. Don't use another person's fire without permission or invitation.
2. Don't wash upstream from where drinking water is being obtained.
3. Toilet arrangements will be decided by the leader of the trip. In general, women go in an upstream direction, men go downstream. Remember to cover all refuse.
4. Don't climb over fences, always get through.
5. Always leave gates and slip-rails as you found them.
6. Don't build bigger fires than necessary. Remember - the bigger the fire, the bigger the fool.
7. Always shout warning of a rolling rock to those below immediately.
8. In the bush, walk several paces behind the one in front of you. It is the business of the second to avoid springing-back twigs, not the first to hold them back.
9. Try to be tidily dressed and well behaved in public places.
10. Remember the distress signal - three calls in succession, and do not give them when not in distress.
11. Don't take unnecessary risks; you may endanger other people as well as yourself.
